- This part deals with other matters it includes requirement for insurance, revisions or amendments of the land code and the date the Land Code comes into effect

- Legal requirements set out by the Framework Agreement
- Definitions: words we use within the Land Code

**PART 2: PROCESS TO PASS LFN LAWS**

- Law making authority sets out the types of laws Lytton can enact and the process in order to pass the laws which includes the need for Lytton First Nation (LFN) members, Chief and Council and Lands committee involvement

**PART 3- MEMBERSHIP APPROVAL BY VOTE**

- Lytton membership must approve of any land laws that relate to
  - Land Use Plan
  - Any interest, lease or license exceeding 49 years
  - Matrimonial Property
  - Expropriation
  - Cultural Heritage Sites
  - Voluntary exchange of community land
  - Amendments to land code except minor edits

**PART 8: DISPUTE RESOLUTION**

- A process to resolve land disputes must be developed and enacted within 18 months of the Land Code coming into force

**PART 6: INTERESTS AND LICENSES IN LAND**

- The requirement to register interests in the First Nation Lands Registry System or a lands register set up by LFN to be valid land holdings

**PART 5: LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES ADMINISTRATION**

- Sets out the requirement to set up a Lands office including staff
- The requirement to set up a lands committee with at least 5 LFN members to deal with all interests and licenses relating to reserve lands and natural resources

**PART 4: ACCOUNTABILITY**

- Includes Transparency and accountability for members
- Sets out conflict of interest rules and the need for developing financial structures
- Requirement of an annual report
- Members access of Land Code laws and policies
